
HIGHLIGHTS

D2.2 Mapping Needs Training Report

Based on insights gathered from SMEs across Europe, our survey revealed **66% of SMEs handle cybersecurity tasks internally and do not use external services.** While this approach may work for some, it often leaves businesses vulnerable to sophisticated cyber threats that require specialised expertise. This finding underscores the importance of bridging the gap in cybersecurity support for SMEs by encouraging access to external resources, tailored training, and expert guidance to build more resilient defenses.
